Dr Mbagaya trained in clinical biochemistry and metabolic medicine in the Yorkshire Deanery after his general internal medicine posts. He was appointed consultant at Weston General Hospital and Bristol Royal Infirmary in 2014. He leads the clinical laboratory service at Weston General Hospital. He runs a specialist lipidology and diabetes service at Weston General Hospital. He also leads the South West regional adult inherited metabolic service at Bristol Royal Infirmary in collaboration with the team in Birmingham. This provides a multidisciplinary service for patients with adult metabolic disorders.

He provides a clinical and diagnostic service, addressing general biochemistry, laboratory endocrinology and metabolic aspects of disease. His laboratory interests include biological variation, patient safety and clinical pathway development. He is actively involved in junior doctor and medical student teaching at the North Somerset Academy where he is the Pathology Tutor.
